General Rules

The Flower Show conforms to the National Garden Club Inc. flower show standards as documented in the Handbook for Flower Shows(HB), 2017 Edition. Handbook revisions are printed in The National Gardener(TNG) magazine.

1. The schedule is the Law of the Show.
2. This flower show will comply with objectives and requirements for an NGC Horticulture Specialty Flower Show. *(HB p. 6)*
3. Entry in the three divisions is defined here. Division I, Horticulture, is open to any amateur gardener. Entry in Division II, Educational Exhibits, is by invitation only. Division III, Photography, is limited to Windermere Garden Club members.
4. There must be an emphasis on FRESH plant material. No artificial plant material is permitted in any exhibit in any division.
5. Native plants may be entered provided such plants have been legally obtained and grown by the exhibitor for at least three months.
- a. Plant material **cannot** be used if they are:
 - noxious weeds on the Florida Invasive Plant list
 - endangered species gathered from the wild
 - plants too common to be of merit
 - *(refer to www.plants.usda.gov)*
7. Judging will be by the NGC Standard System of Awarding and any additions found in The National Gardener.
HB pg. 5
8. All exhibits will be accepted Wednesday Nov 14, 2018 between noon to 4:00pm.

9. The Classification Chairs for all divisions must check and accept all exhibits for conformity to the schedule prior to judging.
10. Judging will begin Thursday Nov 15, 2018 at 9:00 am to noon.
11. The General Chairman and the Classification Chairmen must be available during all judging for possible consultations.
12. Only the General Chairman, the Classification Chairmen, Judges and the clerks are allowed on the show floor during the time of judging.
13. Entry cards of blue ribbon and 90+ exhibits must be signed and dated by an NGC Accredited Judge on the panel. All other entry cards must be initialed . (Accredited or Student Judges may initial entry cards. Top Exhibitor award rosettes must be signed on the back by the NGC Accredited Judge who judged the class. *HB pg. 6.*
14. The decision of the judges is final.
15. Awards may be withheld if not merited.
16. The Flower Show will be open to the public
Thursday November 15, 2018 1:00pm -5:00 pm
Friday November 16, 2018 9:00 am-noon.
17. Exhibits MUST be removed Friday Nov 16, 2018 between noon-4:00pm Remaining entries will be disposed of without notification.
18. The Flower Show Committee will strive to assure the safety of all items after arrival and placement, but is not responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits.

Support & Pre-Registration

The Flower Show Schedule and pre-registration forms will be emailed to club members and will be made available in printed form at club meetings. We recommend that you pre-register your entry when possible to help facilitate registration. Complete the pre-registration form and submit to the Chairs listed in the table below. Pre-registration closes Nov 7, 2018. Remember a photo or common name will help us identify your plant(s).

Purpose of a NGC Standard Flower Show

- To educate club members and the viewing public
- To stimulate interest in horticulture and floral design
- To provide an outlet for creative expression
- To communicate National Garden Club, Inc (NGC) goals and objectives to the community

Standard System of Awarding

The NGC Standard System of Awarding is used in all divisions for competitive judging. *HB pg. 5*

- Encourages uniform standard of judging
- Ensures fair and objective evaluation of all exhibits
- Ensures no criteria are overlooked
- Compares relative importance of qualities

BLUE One first place per class or sub-class, must score 90 or above

RED - One second place per class or sub-class, must score 85 or above.

YELLOW -One third place per class or sub-class, must score 80 or above.

White One or more Honorable Mention as merited, must score 75 or above.

DIVISION I – HORTICULTURE

“Digging in the Dirt”

Rules

HB pg. 55

1. All General Rules Apply.
2. The National Garden Club’s Standard System of Awarding and the Scale of Points for all cut or Container Grown Specimens and Collections will be used. *HB pp129*
3. All entries will be accepted at Windermere Town Hall on Wednesday November 14, 2018 between noon to 4:00pm.
4. Entry cards / forms should be filled out in advance, when possible, and if handwritten, should be in pencil or water-proof pen to avoid water damage.
5. Registering your entries in advance is key to expediting and facilitating the registration classification process. Refer to the Registration Process form and instructions P. 8 for additional information.
6. All entries should be correctly labeled with the scientific name, the genus and specific epithet(species), and the variety. Common name may be also added.
7. All entries and entry cards will be checked by the Classification Committee before being placed in the exhibition area.
8. Exhibitors MUST remove all entries on Friday Nov16, 2018 between noon - 4:00pm. Remaining entries will be disposed of without notification.
9. All exhibits must be fresh and grown by the exhibitor.
10. All plant material must be in its natural state and may not be altered by application of oil, commercial” shine”

products, etc. that change the natural appearance. Wiring of specimens is not permitted.

11. Container grown plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for no fewer than 90 days except for combination plantings which must be grown together for six(6) weeks. Other exceptions are: plants grown from seed, seedling, or immature transplants, bulbs, tubers, corms or rhizomes. Cut specimens must have been cared for as a mature plant at least ninety (90) days. Arboreals (wood ornamentals) must have been in the exhibitors possession for six (6) months.

12. Only one plant per pot is permitted, unless schedule permits otherwise. Plants that grow naturally with multiple stems are considered a single plant.
13. Containers for all container-grown plants are not to exceed 14" in diameter or 20 lbs.
14. Containers must be a conservative color and free of designs. Fancy and bright color containers will detract from your horticulture.
15. Double potting and staking are allowed. However, the inner pot must not be visible and the staking must be unobtrusive.
16. Cut specimens must be displayed in clear suitable size bottles to be provided by Windermere Garden Club. Cut specimens should not have foliage below the water line. The exception is Gladiolus.
17. Only foliage and/or flowers naturally grown and still attached to the specimen are permitted. Unattached foliage is never included with a cut bloom specimen.

18. Wedging, a small, inconspicuous “plug” in the neck of a container to improve the pose of the specimen, is permitted. Wedging may be visible but must not detract from the cut specimen. Plastic wedging will be provided by Windermere Garden Club.
19. An exhibitor may enter more than one entry per class if each entry is a different genus, species, variety, cultivar, type size, or color.
20. Flowering Plants -Plants that are grown for their flowers should have blooms and submitted as a flowering specimen. Plants that are grown for their leaves may be flowering but must be exhibited as a foliage plant.
21. Other Worthy Specimens with a class designation in the schedule may not be entered in the ‘Any Other Worthy Named’ Class.
22. The Horticulture Classification Chairman and/or General Show Chair have authority to subdivide classes as necessary per the requirements for subdividing. *HB pp. 3,4*

1. All general rules apply.
2. The National Garden Club's (NGC) Standard System of Awarding will be used . The scale of points for Educational Exhibits is documented on HB pg. 130.
3. The Educational Exhibits are by invitation only and coordinated with the Education Division Chair, Joan Prasky 407-295-6459.
4. All entries will be accepted on Wednesday November 14, 2018 between noon–4:00 pm.
5. Exhibitors **MUST** remove all entries on Friday Nov 16, 2018 between noon– 4:00 pm. Any remaining entries will be disposed of without notification
6. Educational exhibits may be the work of more than one (1) individual or organization.

7. Educational Exhibits entered by a Student or Accredited Judge who are seeking exhibiting credit must be the sole effort of the individual and entered accordingly.
8. Plant material is not required, but is encouraged by NGC when appropriate. Artificial plant material is not permitted.
9. A minimum of 18 square feet of surface is required for the exhibit to be considered for NGC Educational Top Exhibiter Award.
10. Topic of the exhibit should be presented in a brief, concise and interesting manner. Print size should be legible at three feet.
11. Related handouts may add to the educational value of the exhibit but are not required.

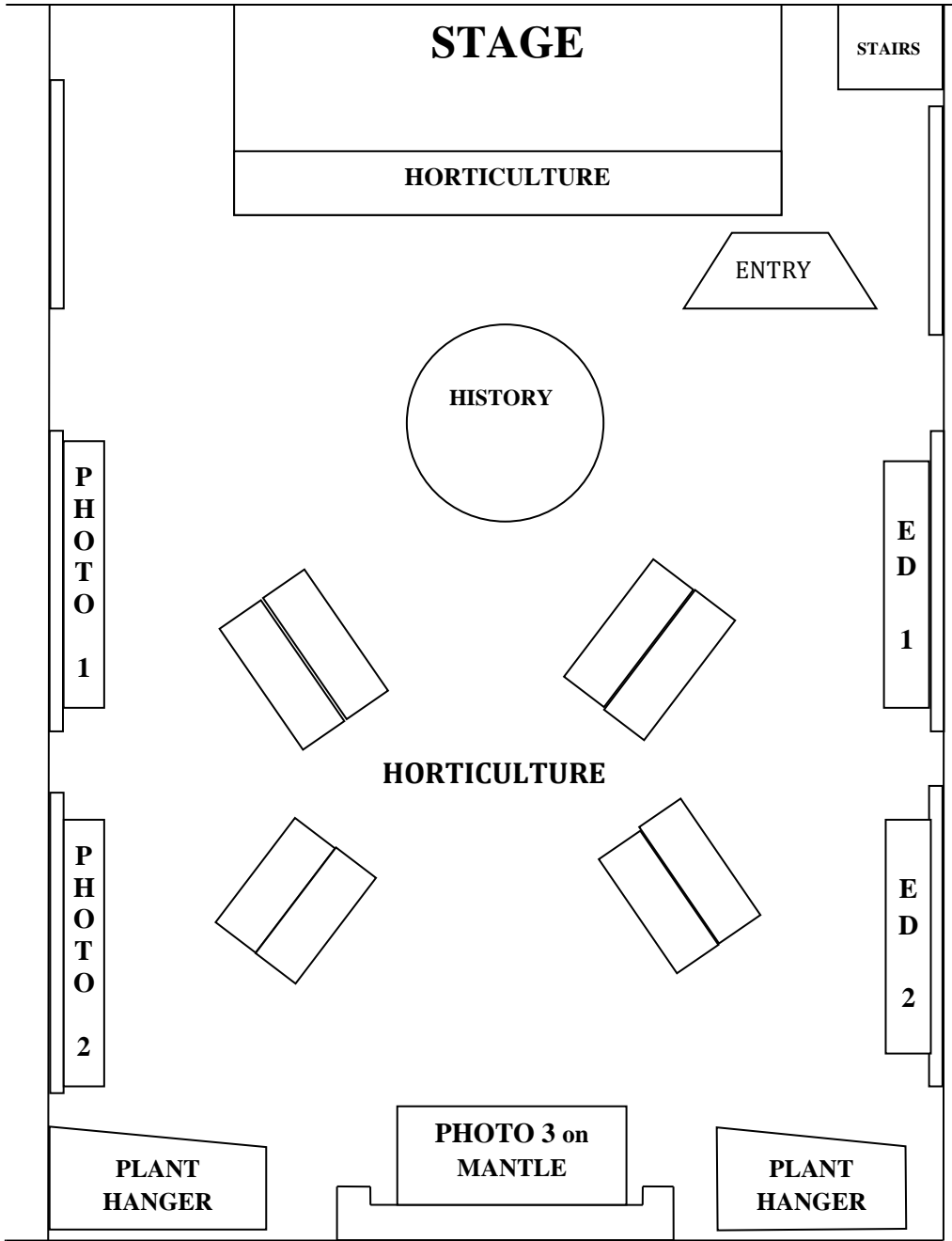
